Assignment 1-Checklist

- 1.) There is a first name, last name, and a date on the paper.
- 2.) There is a title for your book report. The title is capitalized and underlined.
- 3.) The report describes the characters (who is in the story), setting (when and where the story takes place), and plot (beginning, middle, and ending-what happens).
- 4.) Spelling and grammar are correct. This means to indent, capitalize, spell words correctly, and punctuate.
- 5.) The report is neatly written (It can be read easily). **DO NOT** type your report! Please make sure it is **ONLY**

one page long and skip lines. Don't use large lined paper. The more you write the better.

Assignment 2-Checklist

- 1.) There is a first name, last name, and a date on the paper.
- 2.) There is a title for your book report. The title is capitalized and underlined.
- 3.) Include what the topic of the book is, 3 or more facts you found interesting, why, and what you learned.
- 4.) Spelling and grammar are correct. This means indent, capitalize, spell words correctly, and punctuate.
- 5.) The report is neatly written (It can be easily read). Don't use large lined paper. **DO NOT** type your report! Please make sure it is **ONLY** one page long and skip lines. The more you write the better.
